It is the volunteers that make any organization great and we have some of the best volunteers.

When I first began volunteering with MAESSR, I would check the website 10 times a day looking at the dogs wondering which one I would bring home. I know it is very hard to wait, watching dogs getting offered, but let me tell you, it is well worth the wait. All three of my boys have

been a perfect match. We have many families that have been waiting for some time but we are now heading into the summer months which always bring an influx of dogs. It would be our hearts desire to run out of dogs, but that is not likely to happen. Every day new dogs come into rescue. As we have become better known, many families are now turning to rescue instead of taking their dogs to shelters. This is much easier on the dogs and the adoptive families, because we can usually get a history on the dog. Our wonderful group of hard working owner release volunteers then work with the relinquishing families. They have my complete admiration for what they do – as do all the volunteers who help make MAESSR strong.

Emergency Preparedness

As we approach storm season, I thought a few reminders to help you keep your canine friend safe would be helpful. Planning and preparation are the keys to keeping your pet safe and you calm and able to address other storm concerns.

Stock a “go” bag for your pet and have it ready. It is recommended you check the bag twice a year. Items to include:

- Aim for three days of food, water, and prescription medicine for your pet.
- Spare collar and Identification tag to include your cell phone number
- Paperwork – make a copy of your pet’s records, especially proof of vaccination.
- Photos of you with your pet – this can help identify him if he is lost or prove ownership.
- Favorite Toy – Familiarity can help calm pets in strange places
- Leash and harness – even the best trained pet can get scared and run off in an emergency situation

Be sure to develop a plan on who will do what duty in an emergency. Who will take responsibility for the dog? Who will put the pet “go” bag in the trunk. It is recommended a list be drawn up and posted where everyone in the family will know to look. Also, think about asking a neighbor or friend to rescue your pet should an evacuation occur when

you are not home. Let them know of the “go” bag and its location.

While there has been some progress in dogs being accepted in some shelters, they are still banned in many public spaces. Think ahead and have phone and addresses of pet friendly hotels (in your bag) where you will be able to stay with your dog. Remember, planning now will save time and worry later!

WHO'S THAT VOLUNTEER?

April Smith was raised around horses spending most of her young life in horse barns which were always filled with a variety of horses, dogs, and cats. April's first dog that she could call her own was a Springer/mix named Patches. After April married, she moved to Charlottesville, VA with her husband and two sons. There they raised and trained horses for 43 years, while collecting all the unwanted dogs that crossed her path. Moving to a 42 acre farm when her sons were 6 and 8 years old, she began working with the SPCA in Charlottesville and helped form the Louisa County Humane Society (LCHS).

In the early years she was in charge of the LCHS's adoption program and fostering. During this time April rescued two male Springers from a breeder and after re-homing the older one she kept the younger dog. Her love of Springers began. Leer was the love of her life and her constant companion. A year later the same breeder asked her to take a female she had repossessed and sweet Angel came to the Smith family. Angel was a special dog – an abuse case with little trust. April's life has always been full of dogs - hardly a time that she did not have four or five dogs in the house, owning everything from Airedales to hounds.

After retiring from her horse business in 2003, the family moved to Virginia Beach with their only dog, a little Havernese named Debo. April was widowed and lost Debo in 2004. April was dog-less for three years but realized she needed to do something. After looking into rescue groups MAESSR caught her attention and she applied to volunteer. April is now a foster home for MAESSR and has put her experience with animals into helping the many dogs she fosters. April also helps train new foster homes sharing her knowledge with them. April thinks volunteering for MAESSR was the best decision she ever made. April's foster dogs have been a heartwarming experience for her and she has made some great friends along the way. Her time with MAESSR has been a spirit renewing experience, as has returning to her farm in Louisa this January.
